2. COMPOSITION/INFORMATION OF INGREDIENTS	
A mixture of resins and organic solvents as required. For details of substances presenting a health hazard within the meaning of the Chemicals (Health Information & Packing) regulations 1993 see under Section 8 of this Safety Data Sheet.	
3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION	
Prolonged or repeated exposure to these products may result in a health hazard. Highly flammable.	
4. FIRST AID MEASURES	
GENERAL	In all cases of doubt or where symptoms persist seek medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
INHALATION	Remove to fresh air, keep warm and at rest. If breathing is irregular or stopped give artificial respiration. Give nothing by mouth. If unconscious place in recovery position and seek medical advice.
EYE CONTACT	Contact lenses should be removed. Irrigate copiously with clean, fresh water for at least 10 minutes, keeping the eyelids apart, seek medical advice

7. STORAGE AND HANDLING

HANDLING	Vapours are heavier than air and may spread along floors. They may form explosive mixtures with air. Prevent creation of explosive or flammable mixtures and avoid vapour concentrations higher than the OEL. Do not use in areas where potential sources of ignition exist. Electrical equipment should be protected to the appropriate standard. Use non sparking tools and exclude sources of heat, sparks and flames. Keep container tightly closed. Never use pressure to empty, container is not a pressure vessel. Always keep in containers made of the same material as the supply container. Avoid skin and eye contact. For personal protection refer to Section 8. Good housekeeping and regular removal of waste materials will reduce risks. The product may charge electrostatically. Use earthing leads when transferring from one container to another. Wear anti-static footwear and clothing. Floors should be electrically conductive.
STORAGE	Store in accordance with the conditions of the licence which is necessary under the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act. See the HSE guidance note Storage of Flammable Liquids in Containers. Observe the label precautions. Store between 5 and 25° C in a dry, well ventilated place away from sources of heat, ignition and direct sunlight. No smoking. Prevent unauthorised access. Containers which are opened should be properly resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage. Store away from oxidising agents and strongly alkaline and acid materials. The principles contained in the HSE's guidance note Storage of Packaged Dangerous Substances should be observed when storing this product.

10. STABILITY AND REACTIVITY
