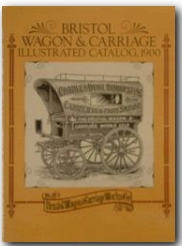


**Boulton & Paul, 1898 CATALOGUE.** Ref: CHT9019

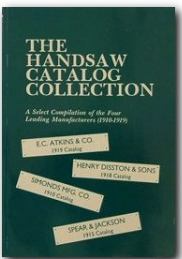

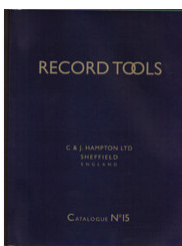

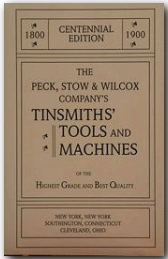

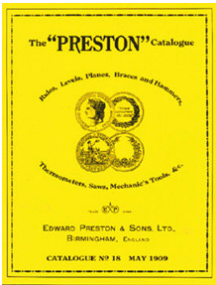

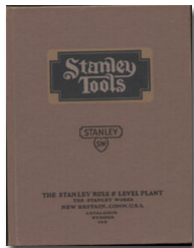
**Edward Preston & Sons Ltd., 1908-1912 CATALOGUE.** Ref: CHT9024 **£15.00**

The company also produced such diverse items as a lawyer's bodkin and a robust sardine can opener. A 26-page introduction by Mark Rees discusses the history, working practices, designs, patent and trade marks of the company.



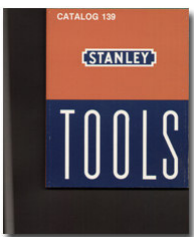
**Sheffield 1787, A DIRECTORY OF SHEFFIELD.** Ref: CHT9021 **£11.95**

A new reprint of the 1787 Directory of Sheffield including the manufacturers in the adjacent villages. In the introduction by Jane Rees she notes that other town directories of this time gave only a general picture of trade and communications with the outside world, whereas this directory includes the marks of various manufacturers such as cutlers, scissors and file smiths, edge tool and sickle manufactures as registered by the Cutlers Company, which often were the only means of identifying makers.



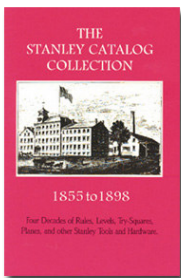

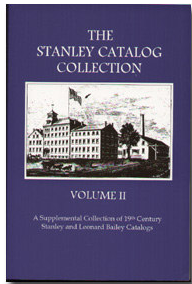
**Stanley Rule & Level Co., 1939 CATALOGUE No: 139.** Ref: CHT9212 **£13.50**

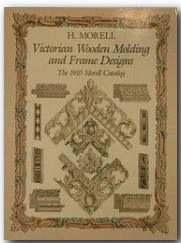
**Stanley R. & L., THE STANLEY CATALOG COLLECTION Volume I.** Ref: CHT9035 **£16.95**

This is a facsimile reprint of a Birmingham Pattern Book with a 20 pp. of illustrated introduction by Jane Rees. It is in the collection of the Essex Peabody Museum in Salem Massachusetts and it is the first time that a pattern book has been reproduced full size (it is a landscape shape). It shows a full range of tools, Birmingham toys, household tools (corkscrews, fire steels, and sugar snips), and Lancashire tools.
